Dear Partners,

As we prepare for the 2020 Tax Season, we want to make sure you have the latest tools and information to help ensure the people you serve are able to claim the tax credits they've earned and get the refund they deserve.

Thanks to Gov. Gavin Newsom and the Legislature, this year the California Earned Income Tax Credit (Cal EITC) and the state's newly created Young Child Tax Credit (YCTC) are expected to put \$1 billion back in the pockets of low-income workers across the state. At the same time, we know that Californians leave more than \$2 billion in state and federal EITC money on the table each year. We need your help to change that narrative.

Part of the problem is that many people who are eligible to receive the Cal EITC aren't required to file an income tax return, because they don't make enough money. However, if they don't file, they can't receive the credit. Additionally, close to one-third of the EITC eligible population turns over each year, so many people will be claiming these credits for the first time. That's why it's so important that we spread the word, not just that these credits are available, but also how to file and claim them.

We have a calculator tool on our website that allows people to determine their eligibility and estimate their refund.

Workers who qualify for the Cal EITC are also likely eligible for CalFresh food assistance and other public benefits. As you will see in the materials available for download, some of our flyers contain information on eligibility for these other programs, as well as entry points to access them. We encourage you to share this information with as well.

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Sample email blast:

Dear [First Name or Friend],

This is an exciting year! It's 2020, the start of a new decade. You might be surprised to hear that it's also an exciting year for taxes here in California. What could possibly make tax season exciting, you ask?

Well this year, for the first time, the California Earned Income Tax Credit (Cal EITC) is available to all workers age 18 and older who made \$30,000 in 2019. The Cal EITC is a cashback credit that can help you pay for the things you need.

On top of that, California created a NEW Young Child Tax Credit this year that could mean up to an additional \$1,000 back when you file your taxes. Parents with children under age 6 qualify for the Young Child Tax Credit with the first dollar they earned in 2019!

Between the Young Child Tax Credit, the Cal EITC and the federal EITC, working families can get up to \$8,000 back in their tax refund this year. Now that's something to get excited about.

But here's the thing: we don't want you to lose a chunk of your refund paying to have your taxes done. Last year, more than 3 out of every 5 workers who received the Cal EITC used a paid tax preparer, costing them hundreds of dollars that should stay right in their pockets!

Irene Nash is a mother of five who works as a crossing guard here in Los Angeles. Last year, after getting her taxes prepared for free, she was able to use her refund to pay off debt, help her buy a car and start a banking account.
