MANY OLDER ADULTS NEED OR WANT TO KEEP WORKING. MAKE TAX CREDITS WORK FOR YOU.

If you are working after age 65 and you earned \$30,000 or less, you may be eligible for the California Earned Income Tax Credit - the CalEITC!

Visit CalEITC4Me.org to use our online calculator to estimate the amount of your credit.

You may also qualify for other state tax credits and benefits:

- If you're 65 or older, you can claim an extra \$118 state tax exemption.
- If you're 62 or older, with an annual income of less than \$45,000 and at least 40% equity in your home, you may be eligible to defer payment of state property taxes.
- You may be eligible for CalFresh food assistance and other public benefits and tax credits. See if you qualify for more help at CalEITC4Me.org.

Older Californians also qualify for FREE tax help across the state:

No Social Security number?

No problem! Taxpayers with an ITIN
(Individual Taxpayer Identification Number),
including undocumented immigrants, are
now eligible for the CalEITC and
YCTC (Young Child Tax Credit).

are not considered public benefits under the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services public charge rule.
