CTC Child Tax Credit	Families with children under 17	The child tax credit is worth up to \$2,000 per qualifying dependent under the age of 17.
CalEITC California Earned Income Tax Credit	California workers and families who earn less than \$30,950 and file their taxes. Filers with an ITIN may qualify.	Up to \$285 for workers without children and up to \$3,529 for families.
YCTC Young Child Tax Credit	If you qualify for the CalEITC and have a child under 6 you may qualify for the YCTC. Families with ITIN filers may qualify too.	Up to \$1,117
Federal EITC Federal Earned Income Tax Credit	Low-income people who work and file taxes with a Social Security number may be eligible.	Up to \$7,430 for families and \$600 for workers without children.
Foster Youth Tax Credit FYTC	If you qualify for the CalEITC and were in the CA foster youth care system after your 13 th birthday AND you are between the ages of 18 and 25 at the end of the tax year.	Up to \$1,117

The California Earned Income Tax Credit (CalEITC) and the Young Child Tax Credit (YCTC) are tax credits for working Californians.

No Social Security number? No problem!

ITIN holders may still be eligible for hundreds of dollars in cash-back tax credits.

If you work and pay state taxes with an ITIN (Individual Taxpayer Identification Number), you may qualify for the California Earned Income Tax Credit (CalEITC) and the Young Child Tax Credit (YCTC). The amount of your cash-back tax credit depends on your income and the size of your family. Learn more at CalEITC4Me.org.

> What are tax credits?

Tax credits reduce the amount of taxes you owe or increase your tax refund when you file your taxes. If eligible, you could receive hundreds of dollars in cash to buy groceries or pay bills-whatever you and your family need.

> Who can receive the CalEITC and YCTC?

To qualify for the CalEITC, you must be a worker who earned \$30,950 or less in 2023, be at least 18 years old and earn at least \$1 to claim the CalEITC when you file your taxes. The YCTC is for taxpayers who qualify for the CalEITC and have a child under the age of 6.

> What if I don't have an ITIN?

You must complete Form W-7 and submit documents that establish your identity to the IRS in order to get your number. Remember: this process can take months, so it's important to get started right away. We can help!

> Do state tax credits hurt my chances of getting a green card or citizenship?

No! In fact, it's a good idea to establish a public record of earning income and filing your taxes.
